- adopted on 11 December 2013








#### Looking to the past...

- Promoting health and physical activity
- Promoting education and training in sport
- Promoting European fundamental values by encouraging sport for people with disabilities
- Promoting gender equality in sport





- Fight against doping
- Promoting social inclusion in and through sport
- Promoting volunteering in sport







- Prevention of and fight against violence and intolerance in sport
- Promoting innovative approaches to strengthen the organisation of sport in Europe







- Fight against match-fixing
- Promotion of physical activity supporting active ageing
- Awareness-raising about effective ways of promoting sport at municipal level
- Trans-frontier joint grassroots sport competitions in neighbouring regions and Member States





- Strengthening good governance and dual careers in sport through the mobility of volunteers, coaches, managers, and staff
- Protecting athletes, especially the youngest, from health and safety hazards by improving training and competition conditions
- Promotion traditional European sports and games

# **Lisbon Treaty (art. 165)**

- -Promote fairness and openness in sporting competitions
- -Promote cooperation between bodies responsible for sport
- -Protect the physical and moral integrity of sportsmen and sportswomen, especially the youngest



# Key ideas about Erasmus+

- financial support secured for 7 years
- substantial budget
- programme serving policies

265,941,000 EUR





# **Budget of Erasmus+: Sport**

- gradual growth in annual amounts
- on average: 38m EUR/year
- starting with 19.3m EUR in 2014
- focus on grassroots sport







# **Objectives**



- to tackle transnational threats to sport such as doping, match fixing, violence, racism and intolerance
- to support good governance in sport and dual careers of athletes
- to promote social inclusion, equal opportunities and healthenhancing physical activity (HEPA) through increased participation in sport and voluntary activities in sport



#### **Activities**

- support to collaborative partnerships
- support for not-for-profit European sport events involving several participating countries and contributing to objectives such as social inclusion, equal opportunities, HEPA
- support for strengthening of the evidence base for policy making
- dialogue with relevant European stakeholders



#### **Selection method**

- general call for proposals
- annual call
- evaluating committee (external experts)
- principles of independence and transparency







## Two complementary actors

- Commission / DG EAC (policy coherence):
  strengthening the evidence based for sport policy making
  dialogue with European stakeholders
- Agency / EACEA (implementation):
  support for collaborative partnerships
  support for not-for-profit European sport events
